Borough Manager Gutonski state a construction company is coming in to do preliminal work on the West 7th Avenue water line issue to find out the proper way to fix the line. He stated there is deed not that's getting close to completion down at water intake. He said that work hasn't been done for about 115 years. He said there's about 16 feet of water that is at the intake. We were down to about final 3 feet. It all that will get cleared out to improve the function of our water plant and the quality of the water. He said to will be have to use as much chemicals.

Borough Manage Lutonski indicated there was a comment made there at the last agenda meeting stating that that borough was out of control. Borough Manager Gutonski said his first seven months was to be training. It wasn't. He stated he has great support of the staff at the Borough. He stated he feels the Borough is in complete control.

He said as tong as we don't have anymore problems with the water line, there shouldn't be anymore problems with the bridge. The said the funds are coming from a bond that we had in page. It will not affect the budget.

The EMS side, 237 calls, representing 1,012 personnel hours. The total company training for the month was 48 hours.

accepted UPMC, we would not have to pay for our benefits. And as long as the benefit amount never went above what it was at that time, 2012 numbers, then we did not have to pay any of those years following. And I'm taking it that it was brought back to council that way because our contract was approved with that stipulation. The police definitely have it in their contract.

There was no wiggle room because the limits were at 9. He said they had to put acid into their water to meet that requirement. He said we asked EPA to raise that requirement.

GUTONSKI Borough Manager Gutonski said the conception of the rain garden was brought to Borough Council at the time stating that it was in compliance with the storm water system that Allegheny County was requiring the Borough to Whenever I work on to improve the storm drainage water. took over as the manager, I got in contact with our engineers and found out that we are in compliance and we were already in compliance with the Allegheny County's storm There was no rain garden that was required. system. bids came in at approximately \$14-15,000 for the rain The Borough still had to pay approximately \$10,000 garden. beyond that that council didn't know of. And then we had \$7-8,000 in engineering fees that council wasn't aware of. To complete the project would have required another \$3-4,000. It's not required. We have it was with the EPA dealing with the way it is. The line is potruding out of the river bank. So the best option for the porough to get out of this because it's already cost the Borough thousands out of this because it's already core the bology and thousands of dollars. Technically, we do have a rain garden because the system that was in place at the time is still there. We did not remove system.

It was suggested by our endineer to place it in a different area of the parking lot. Bill wanted it there.

MS. SIMPSON Ms. Simple that her understanding is it's to help get rain run of water so the sewers won't back flow into the river.

REMARKS --

BORO. MGR. GUTONSKI No. There's two different systems. The sewage authority is involved with dealing with federal. That's what you're referring to. Allegheny County came up with a plan called MS 4 project where it tries to make sure the communities the size of Tarentum comply with to keep storm water from creating more problems going into our river. It is a combined system. And by it going into the sewage authority system, that is what's required. The sewage authority is taking it upon themselves to further that process to improve the quality.
