COUNCIL REPORTS:	Ms. Fox presented several items prior to adjournment. She spoke with PennDOT representatives and confirmed that they will install a turn-around between Exit 13 and Exit 14. PennDOT hoping to open Bakerstown Road by August 27, 2018. Family Dollar is hoping to be open by Thanksgiving. Little Bookhouse project is completed, they have been installed at the Hoops for Sixth playground, Old St. Clements parking lot, and near the Tarentum Park gazebo. Welcomed several new businesses. Joint Comprehensive Plan committee should be comprised of one council member, one planning commission member and remainder from the public, asked Council President to reconsider the committee members.
