CITIZENS:

Regarding any Borough matter.

Adam Findon – Dock #3 – Concerned about renewal of his boat dock lease. Butlt new docks in 2018; cut up old and remaining docks and removed 75% from the area; new dock broke free in late-2018, became lodged under Dock #4-5-6, then later located down river in New Kensington, believes it was done intentionally by neighboring dock owner. In May 2019 he was non-renewed. Spoke with Council President and was granted permission to use docks in 2019. Never paid fee until discovered by Borough in September 2019. Was told in September 2019 that he would not be renewed for 2020. Asked council for consideration to renew his dock lease in 2020.

Larry Steffen – Prospective buyer 150 1st Avenue – Purchasing empty lot next to Wood Street boat ramp; would like to acquire the ramp from the Borough; will still allow public access at the area, but wants to acquire in order to beautify the area and improve the conditions of the ramp; asked for consideration from Council to examine a possible agreement to transfer the property.

Viola Simon – 109 Corbet Street – Asked if there is another way to reach the Borough Police without dialing 911. Informed that there is a non-emergency number.
