Public Safety	Stop Sign Inquiry: Stop Sign Inquiry: Stop sign may be implemented pursuant to Title 75 Pa.C.S. §6109(a)(1). Local Ordinance must be adopted (75 Pa.C.S. §6102 & §6109(b)(1)). Engineering and traffic investigation study must be completed prior to implementation. (75 Pa.C.S. §6109(e), 67 Pa.C.S. §212.4(b)). Traffic study criteria found in Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices in PennDOT Publication 212. Other Related Notes: The Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) prohibits the use of STOP signs for speed control (MUTCD §28.04), as well as PennDOT Pub 383. MUTCD, regarding excessive use of signs, states that regulatory and warning signs should be used conservatively because these signs, if used to excess, tend to lose their effectiveness (MUTCD §2A.04). Mr. Snyder: Would like to see an engineer conduct a study at the area of Center & West 9th Avenue for possible implementation of a STOP sign. Ms. Fox: Would also like to see something done at this location for traffic control. 
