	Motion by Mr. Bonner, second by Ms. Fox to authorize the Borough Manager to execute a Letter of Agreement with Dollar Energy Fund, Inc. to join the Dollar Energy Fund program for utility bill assistance and to further authorize Tarentum Borough to match all initial program donations of up to \$5,000 to satisfy implementation criteria and funding eligibility requirements of the Dollar Energy Fund program. The motion carried unanimously.
Public Comment:	Brian Nolan - 357 W. 8th Avenue - Believes the Police Chief was disrespectful for not discussing the block party request with Mr. Nolan. Does not believe he had an opportunity to address the concerns of the Chief. Should he become elected to council, he will not tolerate this sort of behavior. Recently demolished property was not graded properly and he cannot use that nearby location for the party.
Other Council Comments:	Ms. Homa: Provided information to council about alteration of election districts in Tarentum Borough. Exploring the possibility of consolidating the multiple districts in the First and Third Ward, respectively. Second ward does not have multiple districts. The consolidation should not have an impact on our town or those running for office, but it will assist in lessening the amount of poll workers necessary for each of these locations. Ms. Fox: Provided an update from the Allegheny League of Municipalities (ALOM) annual conference from June 17-20, 2021. Attended several educational sessions including Women in Leadership, Legislative Panel, and a few others. Also accepted the Banner Community award on behalf of the Borough which reflects commitment and dedication to sustainable practices in local government.
