VI. REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The following items of special interest were processed since last month's meeting:

1.) CDBG Program Year 47/FY 2021's Consolidated Plan Release. As was noted previously, twenty-two (22) full Applications were submitted to the Allegheny County Economic Development (ACED) by the COG in November 2020. The CDBG Program Yr. 47/FY 2021 Allegheny County Annual Plan was released to the COGs on April 15, 2021, listing an expected CD 47/FY 2021 CDBG allocation to Allegheny County of \$13,,878,721. ACED Annual Plan included only summary categorical funding allocations (e.g.: for Public Improvements (improvements to streets, sidewalks and stormwater infrastructure): \$934K; for Water & Sewer: \$1.81M; for Parks & Recreation: \$80K; for Safe Neighborhoods Demolition: \$432K; for COG Administration: \$373K; for Removal of Architectural Barriers: \$451K; for Business Development: \$700K; and, for the Allegheny Together program: \$750K) were released, and from which the individual municipal projects have been awarded in the past.

On June 1, 2021, ACED distributed individual funded projects award letters, and a summary sheet of the AVNCOG's individual, funded projects by municipality, which was distributed to the Board, your secretary/managers and yout engineers of record with the COG. That summary sheet information has been adapted and incorporated into our usual Funded Projects Listing, which is organized into the applicable ACED funding program groups (Water & Sewer Projects, Safe Neighborhood Demolition Projects and the COG-wide Public ImprovementProjects), and adds CDBG #s, Total Project Estimates, Project Engineer names, and assigned Bid Cycle. Some of this information will be refined or changed as time progresses; a copy is attached to this report.

Also, please find attached a copy of the tentative CDBG Yr 47/FY 2021 Bid Cycle Schedule. As usual, two primary cycles are defined, and opening dates in September and October are acheduled. As the release of the individual awards was nearly two months later than usual, these dates may be delayed, and the addition of third cycle is possible, if required, as your engineers will have a substantially reduced period to complete final designs, schedule their projects for bid, and compile the actual bid documents. A new federal Procurement Packet governing the bid process for CDBG projects was just released a bit earlier this month; one interesting change appears to be for the allowance of electronic or online bid advertising, though no detail as to approved online advertising sites is currently available.

2.) PA Act 152 of 2016 Authorizes Allegheny County's Blight Removal Program's Initial Application Round Closed on April 30, 2021. In addition to demolition, the program will also be funding Blight Removal/Feasibility Studies and Asbestos Surveys. The program imposes a \$15K

minimum grant, and \$250K maximum grant, with a prevailing state wage requirement for all grants above \$25K. Additionally, a provision for "Emergency Demolitions" is contained in the program. As was detailed last month, five (5) conventional demolition applications were submitted through the Allegheny Valley North COG:

You will note that one of the Act 152 applications above is identical to the one SND funded under CDBG Yr. 47/FY 2021, so will probably not be considered under the Act 152 Blight Removal Program. A specific time-line for making funding awards has not been announced, but ACED announced earlier this month that three new municipal dividion project managers were just hired, with one to be assigned to assist Mr. Scullion with the Act 152 Blight Removal program, so hopefully, we will have awards to report at next month's meeting.

3.) The SHACOG Purchasing Alliance Rock Salt Estimated Requirements Survey for the Second Option Year of the Current Rock Salt Contract is Due Tomorrow, June 24, 2021. On June 2, 2021, Lou Gorski of the SHACOG Purchasing Alliance sent out an e-mail to everyone that confirmed that Cargill, Inc. had agreed to the exercise of the second option year for the current rock salt agreement, thereby extending the term of the contract for rock salt by one year, for the period July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022 Your municipality now has the opportunity to review its annual rock salt usage and adjust, if necessary, its estimated tonnage requirements for this upcoming winter season.

The terms of the contract allow the estimated requirements to be updated no later than the commencement of the new contract year. Accordingly, an assessment of those needs is to be made at this time and reported to the SHACOG office by completing the Estimated Requirements survey for the 2021-2022 winter season. This Estimated Requirements survey is accessed through the SHACOG website at www.shacog.com. If you need assistance in accessing or completing the survey, please call Sue Dawson (412-429-1130) at the SHACOG office. In addition, please be reminded that minimum/maximum purchasing percentages will be based on the estimate you provide in this survey.

Mr. Gorski had set the deadline for recording your estimated requirements for rock salt as TOMORROW, Thursday, June 24, 2021. Please note that even if there is no change in your needs, you must still complete and submit your information. Failure to respond will result in no (i.e., zero) tonnage being listed for your municipality for the upcoming winter season. This would effectively preclude purchases and price guarantees. To avoid this result, you must list at least one truckload (25 tons) for your annual estimate.

 - a.) Mr. Benecki reported that the new Allegheny County Economic Development's (ACED) Federal Procurement Packet, just released this month, allows for an online bid advertising option, but no specific sites have been approved by ACED. President Taliani reported that he and the state municipal associations have been lobbying for years to try and get municipalities to be able to advertise on line, as the cost of advertising is significant, and continues to grow for municipalities in the state, and Mr. Taliani further noted that a no-cost, state administered advertising site would be a preferrable option Discussion ensued.
- B. SHACOG Purchasing Alliance Rock Salt Bid's Second Option year was accepted by Cargill, Inc. for the Winter 2021-22 Season.
