Presentation from Environmental Planning Group on the Three Rivers Heritage Trail design and development.

CITIZEN COMMENT:

Resident Georgie Blackburn expressed what a plus it is to have something for the community to enjoy along the river. I hope it happens.

Carol Talerico from Creighton likes the trail stuff but wanted everyone to know they keep their docks beautiful. Anthony Talerico from Creighton stated we have put a lot of money and time into the boat docks. We would like to have water and electric.

Mr. Boddorf stated that we are aware that many people are unhappy with the dock situation. The water and electricity are not safe, and the leases are not being followed. Other considerations are also in play, including the future of the riverfront. The Borough has the right to do whatever it feels is necessary to develop the area. Residents have asked for fishing piers, public access, and more. There is room for public and private docks, but formal planning must be undertaken.

Resident Walt Rotholtz thinks the trail is beautiful. You should have gotten the permits many years ago, but now you want to take everyone's stuff away, and that's not fair. Rhonda Rothholtz asked about the future. President Dadowski noted that later in the meeting, we will talk about it and need a focus group. He noted there is enough space for multiple things to be done. Nobody in this room is an expert, but as a resident of First Avenue, we want your opinion. There are companies and organizations that could come in an help us. As long as I am sitting here, you will have a voice.

Ray Fortuna from Bullcreek Road wanted to know about commercial leases possibly being given out. President Dadowski stated he doesn't have the answer to that. Mr. Boddorf stated that typically, when a feasibility study is done, there are several options, including possibly a Marina, but it is too early to tell.

Eric Novak from Brackenridge asked the Borough Manager about all the permits and said that they are up to code.

Tom Kuhns from Fawn Township state, I think the boating population brings a lot of commerce to the town. The Borough needs to take that into consideration.
