Furthermore, the Borough Manager noted that under the Borough's ordinances related to waste that every household shall have waste services. He noted that staff do not have the statutory authority to waive costs for residents who don't wish to pay for services. The Borough Council could if they so choose to modify the ordinance. Council Member Fox noted that we don't want vacant property in the Borough. Code Enforcement Officer Anthony Bruni noted the Borough has a vacant property registration program and that some individuals not desiring to pay for trash at vacant properties are self-identifying for the purposes of that program.

Council President Scott Dadowski mentioned that the 133 individuals not paying trash services over the years amounts to everyone else subsidizing costs for the entire borough.

The Borough Manager stated that overall, the roll-out has gone better than anticipated and that they staff have done a good job handling the challenges. He discussed the possibility of a dumpster day where the Borough pays for a large dumpster and residents

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can dump whatever trash they can fit in their vehicle on that day.

Dredging update

Borough Manager Dwight Boddorf informed the Council that the estimated costs for dredging the pumphouse intake is at about \$220,000 this year. The last dredging was completed two years ago at about 130,000.00 and we should consider delaying dredging for this year. Council President Scott Dadowski asked if the Borough will be ok to push it off. Borough Manager Boddorf replied that while not ideal, we can push it off if we have no other choice.

## **Business** Postponed Business:

Discussion on pavilion rental
 Borough Manager Dwight Boddorf noted that this resolution will allow any routine request for a park reservation to be approved by the Borough Manager.

Council Member Snyder asked a question about AA meetings being held there and if it would be a problem if someone else reserved the space. The Manager noted that previously the approval sheet is taken to the reservation to show proof of reservation. Mr. Snyder asked if we could post reservations at the pavilion. Mrs. Fox noted that they have been very understanding in the past.

- Discussion on façade improvement Mr. Boddorf noted the application and material is available online. Furthermore, he noted that we are seeing a lot of investment in the Borough right now and a façade improvement grant has been successful in other governments. Mr. Boddorf went on to discuss some of the guidelines and provisions.
- Discussion on additional trash can Mr. Boddorf noted that the cost of replacement can for stole or lost ones is \$100.00 for this year. He noted that even if a can gets stolen there is still a cost to replace the can. The second item he noted was the Borough is required to pay for approximately 2,200 cans we have to pay for with 1826 given out. For that reason the staff and manager recommend that a \$10.00 per month costs be adopted for extra cans. Council Member Fox stated that she is against any resident paying more than the original 100 costs that was advertised. She recommend that is an

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adjustment needed to be made that it should be done next year. Mr. Dadowski stated that he sees where Mrs. Fox is coming from but there is another side of the argument and that garbage in no longer unlimited and we should pay for whatever the cost of the service is. Borough Solicitor Dee commented that when the next contract comes up that todays prices may impact the contract in the future. Mayor Lang asked if there were additional fees incurred. Mr. Boddorf noted that when you account for staff member time that we never had to deal with before then yes. Currently, we have about three staff members a day spending about two hours on waste-related matters. There were some comments from audience members, but they did not state their name and address before the comments.

Discussion on Summit Hose Roof issue Mr. Boddorf commented that Summit Hose Fire company has a leak in their roof and asked Council to consider authorizing up to \$22,499.00 if needed for repairs. The Borough engineer and a contractor have looked at the roof and there is a concern due to the siren on top of the building. Mr. Nolan asked if it would be possible to put a pole in the ground and mount the siren on top of that.

Mr. Boddorf noted that the Borough will apply for approximately \$58,000.00 to help offset costs for the police changes.

- Discussion on 2023 budget modification
   Mr. Boddorf noted that the Borough should complete a budget modification resolution, although not required, would be a good idea.
- Discussion on annual insurance renewal
   Mr. Boddorf noted that the annual insurance renewal is due, and that the
   Borough will save about \$14,000.00 compared to this years costs.
- Discussion on Comcast franchise renewal with COG

Cable television franchise fee is an annual fee charged by a local government to a private cable television company as compensation for using public property it owns as right-of-way for its cable lines.



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- Discussion on Act 152 Concurrent Resolutions
   Mr. Boddorf noted that these need to be completed for the previously approved demolition grant through the County.
- Discussion on conditional use of parcel 1223-N-90 (Holy Martyr) Mr. Bruni commented that Legends of Pittsburgh (a gym) is looking to purchase the facility and utilize the building and lot for its current services. The Borough will need have a condition use hearing to determine what types of conditions Council wants to put on the property.
- Discussion on Tripak Sewage Resolution
   Mr. Bruni commented that this resolution is needed for Tripak and the DEP
- Discussion on sale of Borough Parcels 1223-P-161 & 1223-P-167
   Mr. Boddorf informed Council that DG is going to possibly purchase the land for a grocery store. He noted that there are some additional requirements that would have to be met in order for them to commit a store in Tarentum.
- Discussion on PennDOT Side Aside Grant
   Mr. Boddorf informed the Council that there is an opportunity through a State grant to help clearcut trees and brushes along the riverbank if that is something Council is interested in.

Mr. Boddorf noted there is an opportunity for the Borough to join the COG in a multi-municipal appeals board.
